Council pumps make operational debut

East Riding of Yorkshire Council's new trailer-mounted pumps and their crews have been commended by communities affected by December's tidal flooding after being deployed to protect properties and to clear standing water in the aftermath of the event. The pumps were bought by the council for £145,000 to provide a rapid response and improve resilience to flooding issues.

During the flood event, one pump was taken to Kilnsea to help the community, and was used for two days. Two pumps operated in the Blacktoft and Yokefleet area, working 24-hours-a-day, to clear agricultural land at a rate of 168,000 gallons per hour. Other pumps were sent to Old Goole to alleviate over-topping at Dutch Riverside and loaned to the internal drainage board at Crabley Creek, between Ellerker and Broomfleet.

Councillor Chris Matthews, cabinet portfolio holder for infrastructure, highways and emergency planning, said: "The tidal surge was the first major incident where the pumps and their crews were deployed operationally and, given the challenging and rapidly changing conditions, both performed to a very high standard.

"We have received a lot of positive feedback from residents and our partner agencies about the new pumping equipment, which have proven to be useful acquisitions by the council."

Blacktoft resident, Keith Gilson, said: "What has been noticeable in the aftermath has been the great support we've had from the council staff manning the pumps, helping with blocked dykes and sticking with us through the event. Everyone was helpful beyond their remit.

"To see, first-hand, the investment that the council has made in purchasing the pumps, deployed in our village, really sunk home to the people I was working with just how lucky we are to have such equipment within the authority. Without those pumps the drain-off into overflowing dykes would have made the situation much worse."

Preston Picture Palace joins Cine Yorkshire scheme

Preston Community Hall is the latest East Yorkshire village to join the Cine Yorkshire scheme, which brings high-quality digital cinema to communities across Yorkshire who would otherwise have to travel long distances to see the latest film releases. From village halls to stately homes, festivals and arts centres, Cine Yorkshire works to screen a range of content, including the latest film releases, art-house favourites, screen classics, archive gems, live theatre and music events.

In Preston, volunteers collect state-of-the-art cinema equipment once a month from the Treasure House, in Beverley, and turn their venue into the Preston Picture Palace. The scheme, which has been running since 2008, also includes Bishop Burton, Swanland and Lund.

Developed with East Riding of Yorkshire Council in 2003, ArtERY Live has been running for ten years and the cinema programme started in Spring 2008. Cine Yorkshire is a consortium helped by the National Media Museum, Blaize, Showroom Workstation Sheffield and the BFI Film Audience Network.

In the coming months, Preston Picture Palace is showing :

All shows start at 7.15pm and doors open at 6.45pm. Tea and coffee is available, and admission is £4. The shows have attracted an average audience of nearly 50 people and proceeds are used towards ongoing refurbishment of the hall.

Mrs Barbara Mendham said, “These film shows have encouraged our community to come together at the newly re-furbished village hall. As the film shows become more widely-known, we hope many more people from surrounding villages will support us during the dark winter months. There is free parking, refreshments, and a warm welcome for everyone”. She adds “The film shows enable many people who would not normally have the opportunity to now see them within their local community.”

Changes at East Riding Community Hospital

The opening hours of the minor injuries service have been extended at the East Riding Community Hospital, in Beverley, to include weekends and Bank Holidays this winter. Residents will benefit from the extension to the opening hours of the existing minor injuries service to include weekends and Bank Holidays over the winter period.

The minor injuries unit is open Monday to Friday from 9am-5pm but growing numbers of patients have been attending the hospital on a weekend looking for treatment. Humber NHS Foundation Trust (which owns the hospital) has been working with NHS East Riding of Yorkshire Clinical Commissioning Group to provide additional community nursing staff.

This means the unit can open 9am-6pm on Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays (apart from Christmas Day) for six months. It is hoped this will help people avoid making unnecessary visits to Accident and Emergency, especially during the busy winter months.

Community cafe to help people through the winter

A new community cafe at the East Riding Community Hospital, in Beverley, has opened, offering value meals to the elderly through the coldest months of the year. The 'Your Community Cafe' will run until 31 March, offering a hot meal option on Monday to Friday for just £2.

Diners will be able to make it a two-course meal with a pudding for just 50p extra. In addition, the café will feed under-fives free with every full-price adult meal purchased.

David Snowdon, chief executive of Humber NHS Foundation Trust, said: "When times are hard, the elderly and others managing on a low income are often forced to make tough choices but we hope this will mean there is at least the option of somewhere to go to meet friends and get out of the house and enjoy a warming, hearty meal that won't cost the earth."

The Hospital Trust launched the new café with a celebration aimed at older members of the community on December 18, where they enjoyed a bite to eat and were given free goody-bags of useful items and information to help in the winter months. There were also stands, health tips and seasonal entertainment.

Festive season debt

Each New Year sees a rise in the number of people seeking advice from their local Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB) about handling their debts after the expensive festive season.

If you know someone who is in financial difficulty, Hull and East Riding CAB can offer advice on budgeting, negotiating with creditors to reduce monthly payments and other solutions, such as Debt Relief Orders.

CAB services are free and confidential and accessible from offices throughout the East Riding. CAB's main office is in Beverley, working with the Cherry Tree Centre, Bridlington and Goole.

There are services from nine further centres and a telephone service available 9.30am – 3pm, Monday to Friday. Appointments are available at nine locations across the East Riding. The telephone number is 0300 3300 888 (standard UK geographic landline rate).

Every Citizens Advice Bureau is a registered charity which relies on the commitment of trained volunteers and funds to provide these vital services for local communities.
